Good To Know

Homeowner Responsibilities



Sidewalk maintenance involves keeping sidewalks pedestrian friendly—daily removal of snow and ice in the winter and removal of encroaching vegetation in the summer. A sidewalk replacement program offers monetary assistance when it comes time to replace them.

Property maintenance speaks of the pride residents have in their property and community. Yards shall be free of rubbish, lawns kept mowed and buildings maintained for safety.

Utility Maintenance is the responsibility of the property owner from their private lateral/service that leaves the house to where it connects to the main. Only flush human waste and toilet paper down the toilet. Non-waste products such as wipes and rags can cause harm to your lateral.

Stormwater Management is an active way to help maintain the overall health of Keuka Lake and her tributaries. It is important to keep rain water and snow melt clean, and catch basins free of leaves and debris. Do not dump anything down stormwater drains or into catch basins. Catch basins transport stormwater to water ways.
